CCVCD Clackamas County Vector Control District

The Clackamas County Vector Control District is responsible for control of flies and mosquitoes within Clackamas County. The goals of the district are to limit the number of vectors thus reducing annoyances and the likelihood of vector borne disease for persons living in the District.

Portland Dahlia Society

The Portland Dahlia Society is a non-profit organization for people in the greater Portland area who grow dahlias. We promote and encourage interest in growing and showing dahlias. The club has been in existence since 1928 and is affiliated with the American Dahlia Society. At each of our monthly meetings an educational program is held with the goal of every member learning something new and encouraging the development of a stronger network of dahlia mentors and newer growers.

End of the Oregon Trail Pioneer Garden

The End of the Oregon Trail Pioneer Garden began with a heritage rose garden which was planted in 1992. The site now includes a demonstration kitchen garden with vegetables and herbs representing varieties grown by early settlers in Oregon. There are also apple trees, grapes, hops, and flowers. The kitchen garden showcases the sustainable gardening practices used by the pioneers and it serves as a teaching tool for the public. In addition to planting and maintaining the garden, Master Gardeners make educational presentations to student groups and other visitors to the site.

Grow an Extra Row

Grow an Extra Row is a project of the Clackamas County Master Gardeners. The chapter rents several garden plots at Clackamas Community College. Volunteers plant and harvest more than one ton of produce annually for donation to local food banks.

Oswego Lake Watershed Council

A healthy watershed benefits our communities by resisting invasive species, encouraging beneficial native wildlife, improving air quality, and filtering and storing fresh water for this and future generations. Healthy rivers, lakes and wetlands increase our property values and benefit the local economy through reduced maintenance needs and increased community livability.

Molalla River Watch Watershed Council

Molalla River Watch helps to protect, preserve, and restore wildlife habitat and improve water quality of the Molalla River Watershed. Molalla River Watch is committed to involving the community and schools in projects using the Molalla River Watershed as an outdoor classroom. Our field trips engage students in hands-on place-based opportunities, and helps students gain knowledge, skills, and enthusiasm towards conservation and stewardship of the watershed.

Portland Rose Society

Portland Rose Society is the (now) oldest rose society in the world! It all began in 1889 with Mrs. Georgiana Pittock. Our mission is to educate the public on all aspects of growing roses.

We have educational programs at 8 monthly meetings, rose pruning/rose care clinics, award winning newsletter, soil testing, shear sharpening, member discounts on fertilizer and sponsor 3 rose shows: Spring show in June, All miniature show in August and Fall show in September

Friends of Trees

Friends of Trees has planted 910,000 trees and native shrubs in 120+ neighborhoods in six counties across two states. We've done this through engaging tens of thousands of community members, and while implementing and growing programming that aims to do this work inclusively and equitably. We plant trees, and so much more.

OregonFlora

OregonFlora provides information about the vascular plants of our state--the herbs, trees, ferns, and grasses that make Oregon home. We share this knowledge through the Flora of Oregon books, the Oregon Wildflowers app, and our website, oregonflora.org. You can find pictures, maps, and details about all of Oregon's plant diversity, as well as tools to guide your gardening with native species

Hopkins Demonstration Forest

A 140-acre, privately-owned forest, open to the public. Providing self-guided exploration, tours, workshops, and education progress for students, teachers and the public, they are supported with volunteers from the Metro Area Master Gardeners and OSU Extension service.

Soil pH Testing
